REFLECTIVE PRAYER

Prayer is a tale of two forgivenesses.

Luke 11:4 -And forgive us our sins; for we also forgive everyone that is indebted to us.

If you think this prayer of Jesus is a mistake, look at 1 John 1:9: 'If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness'. That takes care of the first part of Luke 11:4 and the second part is in Mark 11:25; 'And when you stand praying, forgive, if you have anything against any; that your Father also which is in heaven may forgive you your trespasses.

A lack of forgiveness hurts your relationship with God and with other people. He made you to relate to others-and unforgiveness builds walls where bridges should be.

Prayer:



COUNSELLING FUNDING APPEAL



For some years, we have been blessed by the Blue Door making a grant that covered the cost of counselling for those who could not meet it themselves. This year, Blue Door could only grant half the amount used toward clients' costs last year.

Currently, we have several people who are being assisted by counselling funded by the Blue Door grant, the grant will not cover costs after the end of June 2023. Four of the seven people being assisted currently are Christians and vary in age from youth to elderly people. Some clients can seek assistance through WINZ or their workplace. Others do not have these options.

We are aware that times are financially tight for lots of people currently, but if you can assist with a contribution towards our gap in finances you can be assured it would help another person on their journey of healing or health.

VESTRY UPDATE

June's vestry meeting began with a devotion looking at the question 'What does success look like according to Jesus?'.

The vestry will be exploring this question further in our next meeting as we consider the vision for the future of Nativity.

Included in this will be establishing a process for the redevelopment of our logo.

FINANCIAL SNAPSHOT

Nativity will take part in the Church Life Survey, conducted by the Christian Research Association of NZ.

We were successful in our application for a grant of \$15,000 from the Monitoring Group to help establish our Families Mission and Ministry role (commencing in August).

Nativity received a \$2,000 grant in June from Blue Door for counselling services. We must seek funding for the remaining \$2,000 from other sources., if we wish to offer free counselling for those who cannot afford it.

22 Hilton Place has been sold and Vestry is delighted to announce that the proceeds meet funding requirements for the hall redevelopment.

Stephen Leitch has been appointed as the new Treasurer for Nativity.

Phillip de Bruyn has been appointed as our fourth Parish nominator, alongside Stephen Sheat, Rosalind Mundy and Alex Smith.
