- What is similar about these accounts of the time Jesus spent in the desert?
 Most of the details in Matthew and Luke's accounts are the same. All three state that Jesus spent forty days in the desert.

 Mark's account has much less detail. Mark's account mentions wild animals in the desert whereas the others do not.
- 3. How does Jesus respond to these temptations? What does he use to help him resist?
