Why should I do H&S training?

The Anglican Diocese of Nelson (New Zealand) believes that we have a responsibility to promote the welfare of all children, young people and vulnerable adults, and to keep them safe. We are committed to ensuring they are protected within our organisation from all forms of abuse. The Church is called by God to love, to stand alongside and advocate for those at the margins, those less powerful, and those without a voice in our society.

Is it compulsory?

It is both a legal requirement and our responsibility as loving Christian communities, to ensure the safety of our young people, our vulnerable adults and our stipendiary or employed ministry leaders, and our volunteers.

Every person regularly assisting in a ministry for children, young people and/or vulnerable adults, in the Anglican Diocese of Nelson (New Zealand) must complete this training. This includes all clergy, lay, paid and/or volunteer leaders.

Ministries may include (but are not limited to)

- Tunes for Tots
- Sunday School & Youth
- Link
- Care and Share
- Home Communion
- Prayer ministry

We are also asking our Vestry members to complete this training so they will fully understand the health and safety requirements of our parish.

What does the training cover?

- Module 1: Safety and Boundaries (refreshed every three years)
- Module 2: Protection and Abuse (refreshed every three years)

If you are a leader in one of these ministries, you will also be required to complete Leadership modules
