Dear Nativity family and friends,

When we come together, we do so as family – the family of God. With a family this size, there may be family members present who we don't recognise as yet, but we'll be spending eternity together – so let's get to know each other now!

Wherever you have come to Nativity from, whether as a visitor or to live here, we are family and share a family likeness. As the worldwide family of God the church bears a resemblance to Jesus.

That all begs the question: what is the family likeness? Or, what's the difference between Christians and others? Shouldn't we be able to tell the difference? The answer is a big YES according to the teachings of Jesus. He said:

"20 ... you will know them by their fruits. 21 'Not everyone who says to me, "Lord, Lord", will enter the kingdom of heaven, but only one who does the will of my Father in heaven.' (Matthew 7)

There are many good people of all faiths, and none. They are our allies in the battle against evil. It is however the assurance of salvation we have that marks one main difference. A second is that we know it's the grace of God in our lifestyle, that makes us die to sin and rise with Christ to the new life of the Kingdom.

There are 5 parts to the mission of the family of God that Jesus calls us to. Share the good news of salvation. Nurture new believers in the faith. Care for the suffering. Confront injustice. Care for God's Creation. At Nativity we describe it as being "United in Christ; drawing in, growing up and reaching out."

We don't have it all sorted. We often don't get it all right, but our Lord and Master has set before us a reason for why we do what we do.

May the grace of God give you courage as we together discover the shape of our Christlike lifestyle.

Weekly Prayer Focus:

"Train up a child in the way he should go and when he is old he will not depart from it." *Proverbs 22:6*

- **Mon.** In I Samuel 17 re read of the two strengths displayed by David fighting and music. Those were the two activities that also dominated his adult years. Think and pray about that!
- **Tues.** "Raising a child in the way he should go" means recognising his/her **strengths**. At two years van Culburn played a song on the piano as a result of hearing it played in an adjacent room. He went on to become a pianist of renown.
- **Wed. Topics.** What do your children like? Numbers? Colours? Activities? Reading? Sports? Studies? Encourage your children in their gifts. Pray for them individually.
- **Thurs. Optimal conditions.** A cactus thrives in different conditions to a rose bush. What "soil" does your child thrive in? Pray that you will recognise growth areas in your children, grandchildren...
- **Fri. Relationships.** Some children are followers, others are leaders. Pray about the relationships they have.
- **Sat. Satisfaction.** What gives your child satisfaction? Do they love the journey or the destination? What thrills one, bothers another. Encourage all the young people that you have contact with.
