

Prayer Focus

This week we will continue using the alphabet as our Prayer Prompt M – R

- **Mon.** *Music.* Did you know that music is mentioned over 800 times in the Bible? Music is a precious gift from God. It was created primarily for the worship of God. Read Psalm 28:6-9
- **Tues.** *Praying for our Needs.* Another word for this type of prayer is petition. Sometimes we mis-use prayers, we get too occupied with our needs or wants. Let God decide whether we are to receive what we ask for or not. God's resources are unlimited. He gives in abundance.
- Wed. Praying with Others. There are five basic steps in group prayer that are a good guideline when we are learning to pray with others.1. Jesus is here. 2. Thankyou Jesus 3. Help me Lord. 4. Help others Lord. 5. Use me Lord. Read Isaiah 65:1
- **Thurs.** *Praise*. Praise is the way into God's presence. Psalm 100:4 says "Enter his gates with thanksgiving and his courts with praise."

 We thank God for what he does. We praise him for who he is, Read Psalm 8 as praise out loud.
- **Fri. Quick Arrow Prayers.** When Peter walked on the water and started to sink, he used a quick arrow prayer "Lord, save me." Using quick arrow prayers is a bit like learning to drive a car. At first you consciously think of every move and action it becomes automatic. Try it today.
- Sat. Responsibility. How often do we truly identify with our prayer?

 Sometimes we pray for situations/ people we ask God to act and having prayed we sit back... But praying implies that we are prepared to stand with the Lord in trying to achieve it. Think and pray this way today.
