Theme 8am & 10am: How God Treats Us

WEEKLY PRAYER FOCUS: Have you heard about the butterfly effect? In physics, it describes how tiny changes in initial conditions (such as a flap of a butterfly wings) can affect weather thousands of kilometres away.

- Mon. "Do not despise small beginnings for the Lord rejoices to see the work begin". (Zechariah 4:10)Think of a small beginning you can pray about today.
- **Tues.** You may feel insignificant at times as fragile as a butterfly just flapping your wings.
- **Wed.** Your faith, your words, your deeds, your prayers, your example, your kindnesses, your persistence can release the power of God in any situation. Think about that.
- **Thurs.** God loves to use things that we consider to be insignificant like Moses' rod that parted the red sea.
- **Fri.** David's slingshot brought down a giant. a boy's lunch fed a multitude. Your flappy wings can bring change for all eternity.
- **Sat.** It's not about the size of the seed you sow, but about the God who can make it grow. It's not about the prayer you pray, but about the greatness of the one who answers prayer.
