
Today I begin a three part sermon series: The man or women of God – the anointing. It is based on the lives of three Old Testament characters – all well known to us. First Saul who we will describe as "yesterday's man of God" He has the crown but lost the anointing. Samuel who is a picture of "today's man of God" has to bridge the gap. Lastly David who we call "tomorrow's man of God" He has the anointing but not the crown. He is the future king. Each of these men teach us about the role we can play in pursuing God's plan and destiny for his people as followers of Jesus.

In the end it is all about the anointing of God on our lives. A fresh anointing is essential. It is what replenishes the call and gifts of God. If our anointing (Romans11.29) is not renewed by God, we will be dependent on yesterday's anointing. It's okay to change your mind. Stubborn pride is such a foolish thing. St Augustine wrote a whole book on 'retractions.' That is the things over which he changed his mind.

If you want to explore this more read RT Kendall's book "The Anointing" I have not read the book but we heard him speak on the topic.



And I hope I have that desire in all that I am doing.

I hope that I will never do anything apart from that desire.

And I know that, if I do this, You will lead me by the right road, though I may know nothing about it.

Therefore I will trust You always though I may seem to be lost and in the shadow of death.

I will not fear, for You are ever with me, and You will never leave me to face my perils alone.
