There's still a bag of them under the driver's seat! Then some 15 years ago we'd go online and print a set of instructions off the internet. They weren't

always accurate! A little later we got a GPS unit and now Google maps talks to us on our phones telling us where to go. Other than in post earthquake Christchurch we have found that to be the most reliable, even overseas.

People have always needed maps – be they stars, or moss on the shady side of a tree. In the journey of life itself, we need a map to guide us through the twists and turnings of the years. The most reliable map for this will never be Google-Anything, nor any guide made by humans, no matter the wisdom accumulated by them. The most reliable map to life, is by the author of life. It's the Bible

The Bible is not the sort of guide a blueprint or rulebook is, nor is it a set of instructions of "if this then that." It's far more mature. It's organic. It's at once intuitive and counter-intuitive. It's totally human, but totally divine. It's a word in season. 
