
Dear friends

How are you feeling today? What emotions would you say you carry as you come to worship? What does it feel like? As we step out of the rigors of weekly life into a pause with God and his people, we often catch up with ourselves, and the things that grind us down.

"He restores my soul" the much loved Psalm 23 says of our Good Shepherd.

As we come today to meet Him in worship and to meet each other in fellowship, we

walk into an atmosphere of restoration in many ways. Restoration for many things. Some we are well aware of. Some we cannot name, but it's there anyway. Our need to be restored can be from painful experiences, tiredness, worry,



insults or a range of other causes we have thought about over the last few weeks. The only issue is – will you receive the restoration on offer? If not, why not? A critical spirit can act as a solid block to the grace and mercy of God having full effect in our lives - and it can flow on to affect those around us.

Today, Sunday 16 October, we have two reminders of the healing and hope of restoration that God so longs for us to claim. One is with people. The other is objects. Which do you think is most important?

Firstly, we baptise wee Arlo Harrison at 10am. In baptism we are made heirs of the grace of God and his promises to be restored. Secondly, after each morning service there will be a presentation of the Nativity Restoration Task Group on how we intend to discern God's direction in regard to restoration and earthquake strengthening required in part of the Nativity church building. We hope you will stay. In the coming months that Task Group will be visiting as many small groups in the Parish as possible, to hear your discussions.

May the restoring Holy Spirit of the Good Shepherd sweep over you today.
