Weekly Prayer Focus:

The Bible mentions many articles. If we take time and think about those articles we can use them as a base for our prayers.

- **Mon. Salt.** Matthew 5:13. "You are the salt of the earth. But if salt becomes tasteless it is good for nothing and can only be thrown out to be trampled underfoot by men."
- **Tues.** Stone. John 8:7. Jesus said "If there is one of you who has not sinned, let him be the first to throw a stone at her."
- **Wed. Basket.** Mark 8:19. "When I broke the 5 loaves among the 5000, how many basket full of scraps did you collect?" They answered "Twelve".
- **Thurs.** *Bread.* Matthew 6: 10,11. "Our father in Heaven, may Your name be holy.......Give us this day our daily bread."
- **Fri. Candle.** Matthew 5:14-16 "Let your light so shine before men that they may see your good works and give praise to your Father in Heaven."
- **Sat.** *Fruit.* Matt 7:15-20. "Can people pick grapes from thorns, or figs from thistles? A sound tree cannot bear bad fruit, nor a rotten tree bear good fruit...... I repeat you will be able to tell them by their fruits."
