
Welcome to our visitors today, and those who are new to Nativity. Welcome to our Harvest Festival, in which we thank God for all he gives us.

As we get closer to Easter, in our Sunday themes, we've been looking at the tools God gives us for the difficult times in our lives. They're times the 23rd Psalm calls "the valley of the shadow of death". The tools are called Spiritual Disciplines. They are both celebrations to enjoy as well as skills to be worked on. Sentence: As we draw near, we do so to listen rather than to offer the sacrifice of fools, enable us to be still and recognise your voice Lord.

(Ecclesiastes 5:1 & Psalm 46:10 modified)

Collect: Living God, for whom no door is closed, no heart is locked, draw us beyond our doubts, that in silence we may fully meet you as you are; may we be renewed by you and hear your voice afresh once again. **Amen**

WEEKLY PRAYER FOCUS: If trees could talk......

- **Mon.** Trees are first mentioned in Genesis 1:11 -12 the third day of creation. Take time today to thank God for trees.
- **Tues.** Trees are next mentioned in Genesis 3:1 8 with the temptation in the Garden of Eden and God offering the tree of life. Pray for people you know facing temptation today.
- **Wed.** Genesis 6. The Ark was built of Gopher wood. Roughly 450 feet long. A lot of wood required it would be a big challenge. Pray that Nativity will be open to big challenges from God.
- **Thurs.** Exodus 15:22-27 Three days after Moses had led the people through the Red Sea they were grumbling and complaining and Moses cast a tree into bitter water and the water became sweet. Pray against grumbling and complaining today.
- **Fri.** Leviticus 19:23-25 we read about trees being a provision for the future. Pray for someone you know who is burdened for the future.
- **Sat.** Psalms have a lot of quotes about trees. Psalm 1: 3 "He shall be like a tree planted by the rivers of water that brings forth its fruit in season." Pray that Nativity will be known by its fruits.
