Dear Nativity family and friends,

Welcome this Labour weekend, especially if you're visiting. Sometimes we get so blasé about things in life, that cost other people dearly. Labour Weekend is one of them. In 1840 Samuel Parnell, a Wellington carpenter, fought for the right to an 8 hour day – and won. Labour Day was first celebrated in 1890, but the first Public Holiday wasn't until 1900. This holiday has long had associations with more than just an 8 hour working day, for many Kiwi workers. Some have paid heavily, just for claiming many of the rights we take for granted.

We tend to bring our "entitled" attitude in daily life, to our faith. While we do need to stand up and work for what is right, and honour those who have done so, our ultimate reward has been won for us. We had nothing to do with it other than being loved.

The cost of our eternal life and wellbeing was paid by God, who became one of us in Jesus. His life, his death on the cross, and his resurrection is something we could never earn ourselves. No work, no ritual, no deed however good, can bring us out of alienation from God and each other.

Nothing humanly possible can bring us into favour with God and restore broken relationships. Only that work which God in Jesus has done can do that. It is the ultimate act of grace. Our only right act is to accept this gift with humble thanks, and live lives that display that.

Beatitudes for parents were written many years ago by Marion Kinneman. They are still spot on today.

- Mon. Blessed are those who make peace with spilled milk and mud, for of such is the kingdom of childhood.
- Tues. Blessed is the parent who does not engage with comparison of his/her child with others, for each child has their own special growth.
- Wed. Blessed are those who have learned to laugh, for it is the music of a child's world.
- Thurs. Blessed and mature are those who without anger can say "no", for a child is comforted in the security of firm decisions.
- Fri. Blessed are they who accept the awkwardness of growth, for they are aware of the choice between marred furnishings and damaged personalities.
- Sat. Blessed are the teachable, for knowledge brings understanding and understanding brings love.


