Gladys Aylward led 100 Chinese orphans on a long mountainous trek out of the path of the invading Japanese Army in 1938. When repatriated back to Britain for WW2 she was feted by British nobility. It is said the Archbishop of Canterbury commented "You must have had many things to worry you". "Yes" she replied "but most of them never happened."

How often we worry, needlessly. As we walk with God through life, discovering his presence and purpose, there is another way to deal with the perceived threats. In their course "Experiencing God" (2007) Henry and Richard Blackaby provide and develop the diagram at left.



God is always at work, whether or not we realise it. He pursues a real, personal and loving relationship with us and invites us to join him in his work. He speaks through the Bible, prayer, circumstances, and the church revealing his purposes and ways.

God's invitation for us to work with him always leads to a "crises of belief" that requires us to take action with faith. It means we need to make adjustments to our lives in order to join God in what he's doing.

Weekly Prayer Focus

Are you going through a spiritual dry spell? You are not unique. It happened to Elijah a prophet who had spectacular victories – and then found himself struggling as a failure. Read 1 Kings 18:41-44

- Mon. When Elijah recognised his problems and failures especially the drought he bowed to the ground and prayed. Whatever failure you are facing today take it to the Lord in prayer.
- Tues. Elijah had to ignore all the 'no rain reports' and start believing God's promises. Pray about an area of discouragement in your life.
- Wed. Elijah sent his servant seven times to look towards the sea for rain clouds. Finally, the servant said, 'there is a very small cloud rising out of the sea.' Elijah believed in God's promise for rain.

 Keep praying and believing.
- Thurs. Every success story begins with something small. The servant who kept telling Elijah nothing was happening, finally saw the tiny cloud- it had great potential. God loves to use insignificant things. think of the boys' lunch feeding thousands.
- Fri. Don't be influenced by those who do not share your vision. Elijah's servant kept saying 'nothing is happening. Elijah knew better he kept praying.
- Sat. Your problems are an opportunity for God to show Himself on your behalf. His strength is made perfect in your weakness. Start believing in the small cloud of God's victory.
