Dear Nativity family and friends

Our life journey is not just to a destination. It's also a journey to maturity. And we don't do it alone. That maturity is something that develops best in families.

Again, this week it's been great to see a range of ways in which you care for each other, as a family - Nativity family. When two of our parishioners had serious events this week involving hospital, their care cells were the first to step in, and step up, to support. New parishioners said they chose to make Nativity their spiritual home, because of the sense of family they could identify among us.

Families have mothers and fathers, siblings, old people, babies. They have ancestors whose story makes their current story. There'll be descendants; generations "as yet unborn" (e.g. Psalm 78:6), for whom responsibility is recognised now. So too for us. We are in that mix of people. We may be several of those family roles at the same time. We take responsibility for each other. We are indeed "our brothers and sisters keepers" (Genesis 4:9) as we guide each other to maturity and wellbeing. That's what family members do.

This week we're making available prayer cards to help you speak God's blessing on your homes and families, and on our wider community. Families who are mature do that too.

In families we grapple with the social issues of our times. Family is the very matrix that enables generations to manage change, yet provide stability within that change. As part of the Nelson Anglican Diocese – a part of our extended Christian family – we are talking about how we relate to behaviours some of our more distant "rellies" are doing, that many of us are uncomfortable with. But as family we do it in love and with respect.
