Dear Nativity family and friends

As the Nativity faith family we have a long and strong heritage of knowing our responsibility before God and to our wider human family, being involved in mission, overseas and locally. "Over the road and over the seas" we could say.

For many decades our parish history shows our overseas mission financial giving as unwavering, even when we had important local projects — buildings or otherwise — to be paid for. That continues, and long may it. Similarly, over the decades, parishioners from Nativity have followed the leading of the Holy Spirit to serve Jesus in various forms of ministry leadership, in New Zealand and away, short term and long term. At present we now have sent and are supporting three families who are serving overseas, in addition to our contribution to the wider Anglican family missions.

One of those families has been serving in Asia for over five years. They went one week after we (Bob and Libby) started here. Last Sunday you may have seen them at the 10am service. In the afternoon they spoke at the Marlborough CMS meeting. About 20 of you came to hear them. However, many of you have joined this Parish family since we sent them, so may not know them, their now grown children, nor the cost those kids pay for this mission, leaving home earlier than they would if they were living back here.

Today Wayne and Bronwyn are back to share in our morning services. They'll speak on why they have gone there, and why they do what they do, even when the personal cost to them is heavy. They'll share something of how they do what they do. That will help us to recognise the importance of our support for workers overseas – personally, financially, and by prayer.

WEEKLY PRAYER FOCUS:

Numbers 27:1-11 is an interesting reading about five daughters who could not claim their dead father's inheritance (no sons in the family) They went to Moses to challenge the Law.

- **Mon.** There is much we can learn from this story. When you see something unfair and unjust God may be calling you to challenge and change it.
- **Tues**. The saying "All things will come to those who wait" is not always true. Is there something troubling you that God is asking you to do something about?
- **Wed.** Man may close the door, but when you turn to God, he can open it for you.
- **Thurs.** Complaining doesn't change anything. Solution are found when you decide to face your problems. Pray about your problems today.
- **Fri.** Be clear about what you want. The five sisters became proactive and went to Moses. "Let us not grow weary in due season we shall reap." Galatians 6:9
- **Sat.** Refuse to be deterred by opinions, policies, traditions. By speaking up the five daughters changed the situation for themselves, but also blessed many others.
