Dear Nativity family and friends,

Welcome to Palm Sunday, the Sunday before the celebration of the best news this planet has ever heard! It's also the introduction to that horrible week which lead to that celebration. Welcome also to Holy Week.

Each day there will be special services that help us appreciate what Jesus went through, all the time knowing the cross was ahead of him. Details are in this pewsheet and on our Parish calendar. Monday to Wednesday there will be some of the Stations of the Cross. It'll be in the Taizé style, each evening, for about 30 minutes. Thursday is called Maundy Thursday. In addition to our weekly morning Communion service, on Thursday evening is Tenebrae (the Service of Shadows), in which we walk through the events of the night before he died on the cross.

On Friday morning the Blenheim churches gather to acknowledge together the betrayal and crucifixion of Jesus. When he was crucified, Jesus hung for 3 hours from midday, before he died. Those who loved him and those who were merely curious, waited and watched. They saw some remarkable things. So, each year on Good Friday we have Three Hours at the Cross, six half hour devotions that follow that time frame. Then follows "The Great Silence" ... until Sunday morning.

A number of our Youth will be going to Easter Camp near Christchurch with Rose and Jeremy. It's another way to mark this as a very special time.

Will you walk this week with Jesus, who walked it for us?

Let the same mind be in you that was in Christ Jesus, who, though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God as something to be exploited, but emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, being born in human likeness. And being found in human form, he humbled himself

and became obedient to the point of death— even death on a cross.

Theme 8am & 10am: Palm Sunday Foolishness

Readings 8am & 10am: Philippians 2:1-11 & Luke 19:29-40

Sentence: Hosanna to the Son of David! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest! *Matthew 21:9*

Collect: Jesus, when you rode into Jerusalem the people waved palms with shouts of acclamation. Grant that when the shouting dies we may still walk beside you even to a cross. **Amen**



Weekly Prayer Focus:

The truth and glory of Easter is to be found only at the Cross

- Mon. Lord Jesus, we are all there, we are all part of the shame of the cross. Jesus on the Cross reveals not only God, but we see ourselves for what we really are.
- Tues. Judas... for whom money was more important than relationship.
- Wed. Pilate... on the opposite side of the debate to Caiaphas but playing the same rules....someone's head must roll, if not that of Jesus, it will be his own.
- Thurs. The cynical witnesses... who remembered only the incriminating words and forgot the message.
- Fri. Peter... with his inappropriate self-confidence. The soldiers... in their casual brutality.
- Sat. The centurion... who admired Jesus from a distance. The disciples who ran away.

Lord Jesus, help us this Easter not to run away, but to face the truth that our sin is more complicated, more insidious, more devastating than we ever dreamed and that Your grace reaches out to overcome it.
