#### Dear friends

Welcome to you all, and especially to our visitors.

Today is Mothering Sunday. It's an ancient Christian tradition, very different to the commercial Mother's Day celebrated in May of USA origins and just over a century old. Mothering Sunday was developed in Britain on the 4th Sunday in the season of Lent. As in this year, that makes it close to "Lady Day" the very ancient Feast of the Annunciation on 25 March when the angel announced to Mary that she had been chosen to carry Jesus, 9 months before Christmas Day.

So on this day we celebrate the life and work of the AAW – Association of Anglican Women. It exists to Unite women in prayer and participate in the mission of the Church, and to promote, safeguard and nurture Christian family life. AAW is open to all women. Affiliated to the National Council of Women, which gives members a voice in lobbying Government and to work for positive change through the Social Concerns arm. There is an Overseas and Outreach arm of AAW in which funds given by members are used to support women and children everywhere providing relief in natural disasters in NZ and overseas.

All that is ultimately about service, another spiritual discipline in our series on them during these weeks leading up to Easter. Rose is speaking to us about that today. The AAW and other Christian organisations who lead the church in this way are good examples of Christian service. The service to us that was made by Jesus, in securing the means of our eternal salvation is the greatest ever. Whatever else you have done or do in serving, make sure you have received the blessing of Jesus service to you today.

**Theme 8am & 10am:** Spiritual Disciplines: Service (AAW Mothering Sunday)

Readings 8am & 10am: Psalm 139:23 - 24 & Luke 10:38-42

**Sentence:** Help us to serve you Lord, with all our heart, with all our soul and with all our strength.

**Collect:** Almighty and everlasting God, by your Spirit the whole body of the Church is governed and sanctified; Direct us in the particular ministry to which you have called us, we may serve you in holiness and truth; through Jesus Christ our Saviour. **Amen** 

#### **WEEKLY PRAYER FOCUS:**

This week our prayer focus is on Trees as mentioned in the New Testament.

- **Mon.** Jesus lived with Mary and Joseph for 30 years. What would Jesus have learned about trees from Joseph, the carpenter?
- **Tues.** Luke 3:9 John the Baptist announces the coming of Jesus the Messiah. "every tree which does not bear good fruit is cut down..." Pray today for the preaching of God's Word.
- **Wed.** The same theme was picked up by Jesus early in his preaching. Take time today to read Matthew 7:15-20
- **Thurs.** Jesus healed a blind man who said "I can see men like trees walking around." At the second touch from Jesus, the blind man could see everything clearly. Pray for a second touch today.
- **Fri.** In Matthew 26:36 we read of Jesus agony in the Garden of Gethsemane. "Watch and pray" Jesus said to his disciples. Approach Easter prayerfully.
- **Sat.** Jesus is arrested and crucified on roughly hewn branches from a tree. Read prayerfully today 1 Peter 2:21-25.
- **Sun.** Revelation 22:1- 5 The Tree of Life mentioned in Genesis is no longer forbidden. It is there for all to take. Fruit all year round. Praise God for the tree of life.
