Collect: God of unchangeable power, you have revealed yourself to us as Father, Son and Holy Spirit; keep us firm in this faith that we may praise and bless your holy name; for you are one God now and forever. **Amen**

Weekly Prayer Focus:

- 1 Timothy 4:12 "Be an example to the believers in word, in conduct, in love, in spirit, in faith, in purity.
- **Mon.** Pray that your words may be comforting, calming and character building to the people you spend time with today.
- **Tues.** Be an example in conduct. When Noah emerged from the ark, the first thing he did was he built an altar. Noah had an altar before he had a home.
- **Wed.** Be an example in love. Love isn't a virus you catch, it's a virtue we are supposed to practice every day. Pray today for a regular transfusion of His love.
- **Thurs.** Be an example in spirit. Often the look on your face has more impact than the words you speak. Pray today for your family and loved ones.
- **Fri.** Be an example in faith. Here's a fact that should alarm us. 90% of all those who end up in a cult started out in mainline churches and were never grounded in the truth of scripture.


