Dear Nativity family and friends,

Welcome this morning to Nativity - a church that wants to know what we believe - and why we believe it.

In the early decades of the Christian church, Paul and Silas went to a place in Greece called Beroea. The people there, welcomed the message about Jesus eagerly and examined the scriptures every day to see whether these things were so. Many of them therefore believed, including a significant number of Greek women and men of high standing. (Acts 17:10-12)

For 2000 years various branches of the church have developed and used a way of helping people of all ages to do just that – understand our faith. It's based on questions and answers and is called a Catechism.

Always be ready to make your defence to anyone who demands from you an account of the hope that is in you (1 Peter 3:15)

It's not enough to just accept what someone says.

Starting next Sunday, and finishing Sunday 1 July, each week in our sermons and small groups, we will be following through the Catechism in the New Zealand Prayer Book. The purpose is that our discipleship is an informed and understood faith. Today we introduce the concept of what a catechism is.

May the Lord add understanding as we seek to follow him.

Theme 8am & 10am: What is the Catechism?

Readings 8am & 10am: Psalm 1 & Acts 8:26-35

Sentence: Jesus said, if you dwell within the revelation I have brought you are indeed my disciples; you shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free.

John 8:31,32

Collect: Gracious God, you call us your own and love us beyond measure; in the rising of your Son we are made a resurrection people, free us from the old ways, make us faithful disciples, so that we can share with others what you have freely given to us, who are created, redeemed and empowered though our Saviour, Jesus Christ, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. **Amen**

Weekly Prayer Focus:

Our Prayer Focus this week is based on Luke 24:36-53.

- **Mon.** In this passage Jesus is saying goodbye to His disciples. Pray about... what would be your final advice to your friends/family?
- **Tues.** Jesus offered PEACE. Pray for the peace that Jesus can give to your home, work, church, community.
- **Wed.** Jesus offered PROOF. Bodily resurrection from the dead. Pray for lasting effect on the lives of all who hear the Gospel message
- **Thurs.** Jesus offered PERSPECTIVE. The whole Bible points to Jesus. Pray for the groups that faithfully distribute bible reading notes.
- **Fri.** Jesus offered POWER which the disciples would soon receive with the coming of the Holy Spirit. Pray for the Holy Spirit Power to descend on Nativity and the churches in Marlborough.
- **Sat.** Close your eyes and imagine Jesus descending from the clouds into your day. How does that influence the way you approach this day?




