Dear Nativity family and friends

We all need our heroes. And we need to celebrate them. On Tuesday 31 October the Christian church celebrates 500 years since Martin Luther launched The Reformation of the church.

Even he had his heroes who shaped him. Despite being a poor family, the first was his Dad who saw him into law school. When young Martin became a monk, an unknown mentor told him to focus his life exclusively on Christ, and this would later provide him with the guidance he sought. It was powerful advice.

Who shaped you? Who is shaping you now? And who do you shape?

Mentoring is something we can all do. This Parish pioneered the mentoring project called Fresh Perspective which went nationwide. Due to a collapse in funding, the national organisation was unable to continue, but at an informal level some of that mentoring continues. We see families better able to cope with modern life hazards.

If you're "a self-made" man or woman, you're actually just pushing the proverbial water uphill with a rake. We were not created to be independent, nor dependant. We were created to be inter-dependant – to help each other.

"For as in one body we have many members, and not all the members have the same function, so we, who are many, are one body in Christ, and individually we are members one of another.

Now, while you're thinking about this, contact someone who has inspired or mentored you, and say thanks! Then celebrate the memory of those who did that but are now in Glory.



WEEKLY PRAYER FOCUS: Good ideas come from God – so ask Him for one. The world has been blessed by those who did just that.

- **Mon.** James Simpson, a Scottish doctor in 1847 responded to reading in the Bible "And the Lord God caused a deep sleep to fall upon Adam." That led to him experimenting with chloroform the beginning of general anaesthetic.
- **Tues.** At first, he met with much opposition and prejudice but that turned when Queen Victoria gave birth to her eighth child under chloroform and she declared she was greatly pleased.
- **Wed.** One God given idea can change so much. In 1824 a Christian, Louis Braille invented a language for the visually impaired. The Bible could now be read by the blind.
- **Thurs.** Did you know that we owe our mobile phone and computer to another Christian Samuel Morse. His first message sent by cable read "What God has wrought."
- **Fri.** Louis Pasteur another Christian introduced sterilisation methods that eventually saved the lives of millions.
- **Sat.** The typewriter was invented by a Christian in 1867 Christopher Sholes was concerned that his pastor had no time to write Sunday sermons. Six years later Remington recognised the typewriter as something that could revolutionise business. It was the Christian Women who started classes to train women to type.
