Dear Nativity family and friends,

Happy Father's Day. Whatever your memories of fathers and fatherhood may be - joyful or hard - we bless you for healing of sadness and regrets, for the fulfilment of memories and hopes.

There have been several programmes on TV in recent years about families finding each other again. Dads often feature as the one who disappeared – or sometimes as the one who brought up the kids after something happened to Mum. Many of the people featured grieve not having had a Dad they knew, or because their Dad is dead – and others because they miss his love and advice. Maybe you wish you could have made amends with your Dad. War and social pressures have played their parts in separating fathers from their families – physically, mentally and emotionally.

In the most recent issue of Taonga (magazine of the Anglican church in Aotearoa, NZ and Polynesia) an article articulated the struggle our generations have with calling God "Father". The writer makes the point well that there are many images of God in the Bible.

This year, may you know the strength and goodness that comes of knowing our


God as Father.
