Welcome to visitors, returnees and those who are here each week. Welcome.

We've had cause to say several times in the last few months that we are on a new journey. It won't be a comfortable one for a number of reasons. But it's impossible for us to stay where we are and live.

> "You have heard; now see all this; and will you not declare it? From this time forward I make you hear new things, hidden things that you have not known" (Isaiah48:6)
