Dear Nativity family and friends,

It's Advent! A season of anticipation. A time to be focussed on preparation. A season four weeks long, ending with Christmas.

People regard it as "The" event with treats, carols, and busy-ness, then most forget that stuff and collapse in a heap of self indulgence.

We however have something better for this season. Far better.

Our anticipation is for beyond the end of the four weeks. The preparation is not frenzied, but peaceful exploration, that is best worked out with times of prayerful stillness, and self examination. Christmas is the climax – and it lasts 12 days, right through to 6 January.

It's all about the coming of Jesus – 1stly about when he came, born as a tiny helpless human baby. 2ndly about when he will come again. That may be at the end of our earthly life, or at the end of time. Both are important. The 1st leads us to the 2nd which we need to be prepared for.

There are signs to help us. One is HOPE. When we light the 1st Advent candle today, we'll be naming the totally sure HOPE that God gives us, as a focus for us this week. It's a hope that will not let us down. It carries a certainty about who we are and whose we are. It assures us we will see Jesus face to face, knowing him as we are known by him.

"May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, so that you may abound in hope by the power of the Holy Spirit" (Romans 15:13)

Advent blessings to you as you anticipate and seek that marvellous hope.

Theme 8am & 10am: Signs of His Coming

Readings 8am & 10am: Revelation 21:5-6 & Job 15:9-15

Sentence: To you Lord I lift up my soul; my God I have put my trust in you; you are God my Saviour; for you have I waited all the day long. *Psalm 25:1.4*
