Dear Nativity family and friends,

Early in each new year there is usually a sense of excitement. Sometimes it's tinged with apprehension. By the time you read this Libby and I will have celebrated the marriage of our oldest son William, to Kathryn, in Nelson. It's been an adventure for them as for us, with both the hope and the work, keeping things on track – and an eye on the weather!

As the church we're on an adventure too, and our leader, Jesus, equips us to finish the journey, and grow like him on the way. This adventure follows Jesus into eternity. We're just at the beginning. Sometimes it has implications that stretch way beyond our town, such as "Motion 29" for General Synod in May. That has some hard aspects to it. (More on that soon).

As part of the local church in Marlborough, in this part called Nativity, 2018 has some new ways for us to walk. Like William and Kathryn's wedding, we've been aware of some things for quite a while. Other things on this year's adventure are more recent and other things will just pop up as we go.

Developing our buildings so they match the journey ahead is not new. Neither is developing our children youth and family ministries and the ways we worship to help them. However, some of the details in that bring surprises. One is our evening worship. Late last year we started planning

1st - how that service could support our young families, so they can grow in faith together here and at home; and

2nd - how it could bring our youth into the mainstream of the church at worship so when they finish youth group, church isn't a foreign land.

After as much discussion with those involved as possible during January, our evening worship will begin at the new time of 5.30pm tonight.

## **Weekly Prayer Focus:**

Over the next five weeks we are going to look at an  $\mathbf{A} - \mathbf{Z}$  approach to prayer May our Lord bless us as together we learn more about prayer.

- Mon. A ... some advice. If you wait until you feel like praying, you may never get around to it. It is God who is prompting you as you read this page.
- Tue. **B... the prayer of blessing.** Imagine God's blessing as a shaft of light, the light from His face, and that we put one another into that light and pray 'The Lord bless you.'
- Wed C... Confession. Jesus wants to fill the river-bed of your life and move the sin. (the logs and debris) that is there. Take God at His promise...He forgives.
- Thurs. D... Doubts. Difficulties. Distractions. An Italian proverb says 'The bursting of the petals say flowers are coming. When your heart bursts with pain, grief and doubts remember it comes to let the flower out.'
- Fri. E... Expecting God to answer. To have faith is too sure of the things we hope for, to be certain of the things we cannot see.' Think of the day ahead and talk over the details of the day with the Lord.
- Sat. F... Fasting. Jesus did not say 'If you fast' He said, 'When you fast.' In a small way give a fast to the Lord today (perhaps go without a coffee!) and make that a prayer time.
