Dear friends

Welcome here this Waitangi Weekend, and especially to those visiting us at Nativity. Welcome is one of several key values that this national holiday and the Treaty of Waitangi stand for. These values are notifications for how God calls us to live. They're to us as a nation, but also to us as the church, for the church was instrumental in the creation and adoption of the Treaty.

Therefore welcome, thrice welcome, to the presence of the worship of God by this part of His family today. This is all at the very foundation of our story.

Alongside the theme of "welcome" is "integrity" and "honesty". All are Biblical principles we and all humanity are called to. They are in the Treaty of Waitangi because it's authors had a Biblical base. We the church are right to mark it, as we the nation do, even though it seems that since 1840, the Treaty and the values have been honoured in the breach more than the fact.

177 years ago Henry Williams, (an Anglican Missionary and Priest) brought a copy of the Treaty to Marlborough. Here, on 4 and 5 May, then 17 June, it was signed by many local Ariki (Chiefs). Wesleyan Missionary and Minister at Port Underwood, Samuel Ironside championed it. For the next few years the gospel flourished among local Maori largely because of it.

Our Parish mission statement aligns with those values of welcome, integrity and honesty. We call them "Drawing in, growing up and reaching out". This is our story. It is the gospel story given to us by God in Jesus. We are invited back to this our story today, of Jesus and his love.


