Dear Nativity family and friends

This time of year is so holiday focussed. Most of us seem to be thoroughly amazed that shops seem to get Christmas decorations out in October! But it's a society thing.

Marlborough has Labour Weekend, Anniversary Weekend, and Garden Marlborough all in quick succession. Add to that we've just commemorated All Saints Day (kids are being prompted to do Halloween) and 500 years since Martin Luther started The Reformation.

Today we have another 3 commemorations, a mix of the good, the sad and the horrible. The horrible is of course the macabre Guy Fawkes. The sad is from our own New Zealand history when on this day in 1881 a peaceful Maori Christian village in Taranaki was invaded by Government armed forces. Many of the men were taken away and died in custody, guilty of nothing.

The good celebration is that for 40 years the NZ Anglican church has been ordaining women as Priests. Here at Nativity, Miriam Taylor and Sue Howarth exercise a fine Priestly ministry. In our neighbouring parishes we're blessed with more fine women Priests and Deacons.

All of this is an illustration of how we need to grow in faith both as individuals and as church. It's a natural and God given progression of life to do so. Some of our children move up from Discoverers to Youth; and some youth prepare to leave home - and we celebrate all that. It is as it should be. It's a combination of life in the "real world" and in the real God. A mix of the expected and surprises. It's the journey of life.
