

Prayer Focus

""Getting Serious about God" was an article I read years ago (and sayed). If you want to be serious about God, reflect on the early Christians.

- Mon. They took church seriously. "The believers met together every day." Their encounter with Jesus transformed their priorities. Acts 2:46.
- Tues. They took fellowship seriously. Church is more than a common interest social club. We're family. As a believer You may survive apart from the church, but you can't thrive.
- Wed. They took prayer seriously. The New Testament Church was conceived in the womb of prayer. "After ten days of united prayer in the upper room everyone was present and filled with the Holy Spirit. Matthew 11:28-30
- Thurs. They took God's Word seriously. Acts 2:42 "They spent their time learning: Research tell us that today exercise, and cappuccinos is replacing serious Bible study.
- Fri. They took praise and worship seriously. They stayed continually at the temple, praising God. Being a spectator at a Sunday service isn't enough. Psalm 100:4.
- Sat. They took outreach seriously. They took the Word with them and planted new churches. God's Word enabled them to withstand life's challenges.
