Dear Nativity family and friends,

Welcome today. Welcome with all you bring and especially your stories of who you are, where you've come from, and where you're going. Everyone has a story and it's important to know what your story is, and how to tell it. And somewhere inside everyone, is a love for stories!

"We lose the magic whenever we stop telling our story" (Tennessee Williams, fiction writer)

The importance of telling our story is well documented in society today. Everything from the search for justice by marginalised groups, to psychological health or selling a product, benefits from telling our story. (Just Google "telling our story" if you want to see more!)

This week we begin 6 weeks of looking at a book in the Bible, the letter to the Galatians. It has some particular lessons for us to apply, that are timely. As one of the earliest letters of St Paul to 1<sup>st</sup> century churches it means in our times where much of society knows little of Christian faith – and cares less – we have a lot in common with those Paul wrote to. It starts with his story and the basis that all followers of Jesus have, to know and tell their story.

So then, each of us will be accountable to God (Rom 24 v12) "Let us hold fast to the confession of our hope without wavering, for he who has promised is faithful." (Hebrews 10 v23)

Hopefully you'll know how to tell your story, in just 1 minute by the time you leave today. It's the story of His-story, in you, to a world that needs to know

Tues. Help others to become successful. Don't be interested just in yourself, become interested in others too.

Wed. Create a climate of confidence around you. As long as you keep speaking words of doubt, you'll never experience victory. Remind yourself that "your sufficiency is of God." ( 2 Cor. 3:5)

Thurs. Stay informed. "A wise man will hear and increase in learning." (Prov,1:5) Observe, read, and grow. If you are willing to pay money for a good meal, but not a good book, perhaps you value your appetite more than your intellect.

Fri. Picture yourself attaining your goal. Think and talk success, Moses did that he refused to turn back.

Sat. Write down your plan and establish deadlines. Make the most of time and opportunity (Eph 5:16)

Sun. Set a realistic goal, and work towards it one priority at a time. Avoid distractions.
